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#### § 22-1. Board of Review.

- A. Composition; powers and duties. The Board of Review of the Village of Endeavor shall be composed of six members, including the Village President, the Village Clerk-Treasurer and all members of the Village Board of Trustees. The Board of Review shall have the duties and powers prescribed by § 70.46, Wis. Stats.
- B. Confidential information. Whenever the Assessor, in the performance of the Assessor's duties, requests or obtains income and expense information pursuant to § 70.47(7)(af), Wis. Stats., or any successor statute thereto, then such income and expense information that is provided to the Assessor shall be held by the Assessor on a confidential basis; except, however, that the information may be revealed to and used by persons in the discharge of duties imposed by law; in the discharge of duties imposed by office (including but not limited to use by the Assessor in performance of official duties of the Assessor's office and use by the Board of Review in performance of its official duties); or pursuant to order of a court. Income and expense information provided to the Assessor under § 70.47(7)(af), Wis. Stats., unless a court determines that it is inaccurate, is, per § 70.47(7)(af), Wis. Stats., not subject to the right of inspection and copying under § 19.35(1), Wis. Stats.

#### § 22-2. Plan Commission.

- A. The Plan Commission shall consist of seven members as follows: the Village President who shall be its presiding officer, the Village Engineer, the President of the Park Board, a Trustee and three citizens. Citizen members shall be persons of recognized experience and qualification. Plan Commission members shall be compensated at the rate set by the Village Board.
  - (1) The Trustee member shall be elected by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Trustees upon creation of the Commission and during each April thereafter.
  - (2) The three citizen members shall be appointed by the Village President to hold office for a period ending one, two, and three years, respectively, from the succeeding first day of May, and thereafter annually during April one such member shall be appointed for a term of three years.

- (3) Additional citizen members shall be appointed in lieu of a Village Engineer or President of the Park Board to hold office for a period ending one year from the succeeding first day of May and thereafter annually during the month of April. Whenever a Park Board is created or a Village Engineer appointed, the President of such Board or such Engineer shall succeed to a place in the Village Plan Commission when the term of an additional citizen member shall expire.
  - (4) All vacancies on the Village Plan Commission shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same number as appointed for the full term.
- B. The Village Plan Commission shall have the powers and duties prescribed in § 62.23, Wis. Stats., and such other powers and duties as shall be vested in it from time to time by the Board of Trustees. Applications for rezoning to be brought before the Plan Commission shall be accompanied by a fee as set by the Village Board.

### **§ 22-4. Board of Health.**

The Board of Health may make reasonable and general rules for the enforcement of the provisions of this Code and for the prevention of the creation of health nuisances and the protection of the public health and welfare and may, where appropriate, require the issuance of licenses and permits. All such regulations shall have the same effect as ordinances, and any person violating any of such regulations and any lawful order of the Board shall be subject to the general penalty provided for in this Code.<sup>1</sup>
